PARALEGAL STUDIES

Paralegal Studies Associate in Science Degree (CIP# 1722030200)

(Articulated A.S. to B.A/B.S. Career Path)

Valencia's Paralegal Studies Program is approved by the American Bar Association.

This program is designed to prepare students to work in the legal field for law firms, banks, corporations, and government agencies in the performance of delegated, substantive legal services under the supervision of a licensed attorney. Students receive instruction in the substantive and procedural law necessary to function in the legal environment under the direction and supervision of attorneys in areas such as civil litigation, real property, legal research and writing, business organizations, and legal technology. Students will understand the ethical framework within which they will work and will be able to analyze and communicate effectively in these areas. Instruction stresses practical applications.

The services paralegals provide include assisting in trial preparation, drafting court pleadings and related documents, performing legal research and informal investigations, preparing real estate documents and assisting in real estate closings, drafting contracts, and maintaining corporate books. Paralegals cannot give legal advice, accept a case, set a fee, or present a case in court and may not provide legal services directly to the public, except as permitted by law.

This program is designed for students who seek immediate employment in the legal environment and who may also decide to transfer as a junior to complete a Bachelor's degree in Legal Studies at one of the two Florida public universities to which this degree will transfer. Students may transfer through a statewide agreement to Florida Gulf Coast University (FGCU) or through a specific program agreement to the University of Central Florida (UCF). Additional general education and legal specialty courses will be required in the university program.

Per American Bar Association (ABA) requirements for approved paralegal studies programs, students must take at least nine (9) semester credits or the equivalent of legal specialty courses through synchronous instruction. Synchronous instruction includes traditional face-to-face courses as well as RTV (Real Time Virtual) courses. Valencia College has identified PLA 1104 LEGAL RESEARCH AND THEORY I, PLA 1114 LEGAL RESEARCH AND THEORY II, and PLA 2192C LEGAL RESEARCH AND THEORY III CAPSTONE which will be offered in these formats every semester. Students will be required to take these three classes synchronously and at Valencia College. These three courses will not be accepted as transfer or transient courses from any other institution.

In addition, per ABA Guidelines Valencia College will allow its students to transfer up to 6 credits of "legal specialty" (PLA) courses completed with a "C" or higher at other institutions. Before this credit is accepted at Valencia College, the program director or qualified faculty member (in consultation with the Dean) will evaluate the transferring course to ensure its academic equivalency to a Valencia College Paralegal Studies A.S. course.

Although scheduling may not always provide for the following progression of courses, students should use the foundation, intermediate and specialization course sequence as a guide in program planning. This is found at https://valenciacollege.edu/paralegal-studies/.

Students are strongly encouraged to consult a Student Success Coach in the department office for assistance in determining the best education plan for their career goals.

All degree-seeking students must satisfy entry testing requirements and satisfactorily complete all mandatory courses in reading, student success, mathematics, English, and English for Academic Purposes in which the student is placed.

Start Right

Degree-seeking students enrolling at Valencia for the first time will have a limited range of courses from which to choose for their first 18 college-level credits. Within the first 18 college credit hours, you will be required to take ENC1101 (3 credits), and if applicable, SLS 1122 (3 credits) and a mathematics course appropriate to your selected metamajor (3 credits). The remaining courses will be chosen from the General Education Core Courses in humanities (3 credits), science (3 credits), or social science (3 credits), and/or the introductory courses within the A.S. degree programs. For specific courses see the *Foundation Courses* on the "Program Requirements" tab. For course sequencing recommendations, see your Student Success Coach or create an education plan by logging into MyVC, clicking on the LifeMap tab and clicking My Education Plan.
