#### **Application Fee**

#### **Admission Requirements**

Students must submit official transcripts from all prior colleges and universities and must meet one of the following criteria:

- Completion of an Associate in Arts (A.A) degree\* from a regionally accredited institution with a minimum of 60 semester hours of course work and a 2.0 overall Grade Point Average (GPA).
- Completion of an Associate in Science (A.S.) degree\* from a regionally accredited institution with a minimum of 60 semester hours of course work and a 2.0 overall Grade Point Average (GPA).
- Completion of at least 60 semester credit hours of college level course work at a regionally accredited institution, including 15 credits that are in applicable to Valencia's College's General Education Program requirements, with a minimum of a 2.0 overall Grade Point Average (GPA).

\*Other Associate or higher degrees must be formally evaluated by the Business Department for admission.

# Students with an A.S. Degree

Students who have completed an Associate in Science (A.S) degree typically possess 15 -21 hours of transferable general education courses. While missing credits may be completed after program admission, students must complete all Valencia General Education requirements and all Gordon Rule requirements in order to successfully complete the bachelor program. A.S. degree student must have the following coursework:

- 39-45 credit hours in discipline-specific courses
- · 15-21 credit hours in general education.

In their junior and senior years, students will be required to complete:

- An additional 15-21 credit hours of general education.
- 45 credit hours of required lower and upper-division technical courses
- Students must complete one of the following courses: CGS 1060C, CGS 2091C, CGS 2100C, CGS 2510C, or CGS 2545C unless one of those courses was previously completed.

**Note** Students should consult the BASBOL Program Advisor to ensure they are taking the appropriate courses and to avoid taking excess credits.
