The Bachelor of Science (B.S.) in Elementary Education degree prepares aspiring teacher candidates for successful careers shaping the next generation of leaders. This program, designed to layer on top of an Associate in Arts degree, will equip students with the information, skills, and experiences necessary to lead tomorrow's elementary classrooms. Future teacher candidates in this program will have opportunities to engage in classroom settings while observing and interacting with students, teachers, and school administrators. Students will learn from highly qualified faculty and highly qualified teacher mentors within their school of placement. During the program, students will gain skills and utilize strategies that will prepare them for addressing the needs of diverse learners.

Upon completion of the Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education program at Valencia College, graduates will be eligible for Florida Elementary Teacher Certification (K-6) and endorsements in Reading (K-12) and English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL, K-12). Valencia graduates will be well prepared for employment in Florida public, charter, and private schools as teachers from kindergarten to grade six.

- Proof of passing scores for at least 2 of the 4 subtests for the Florida Teacher Certification Examination (FTCE) General Knowledge Test (GKT) (<https://www.fldoe.org/teaching/certification/general-cert-requirements/general-knowledge.shtml>) (please see Additional Program Requirements below).
- Grade of "C" or better in EDF 2005 (or EDF 1005).
- District background check for volunteers (please contact the Elementary Education department for information). Students must pass the criminal background check and may also

be subject to a drug screening. **Additional Program Requirements:**

- Students must pass all four of the General Knowledge Test (GKT) subtests by the end of their first semester in the program.
- Students must complete all courses with a grade of "C" or better and pass the Professional Education Test and the Elementary Education K-6 subject area examination before enrolling in RED 4940, EDE 4943, and EDE 4936. If certification tests are not passed by scheduled student teaching field experiences start date, or if a student willingly postpones scheduled student teaching field experiences, successful completion of a Senior Student Teaching Extension Plan (SSTEP) will be required to enroll in senior student teaching field experiences for the subsequent semester. The SSTEP will be approved by Elementary Education department and will be designed to support students with a timeline and resources to pass the required Florida Teacher Certification Examinations (FTCE) or to address specific student needs.
- Students must complete RED 4940, EDE 4943, and EDE 4936 successfully with a grade of "C" or better, and maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or better.
